Chapter Name: A lecture upon the shadow

Q1 How do the shadows before noon differ from the shadows afternoon? What do the two kinds of shadow represent?

Answer. The time of noon lasts for a very short span. At 12 pm noon arrives, its neither morning nor evening. Poet compares noon to lovers, as there is no perfect time to fall in love and understand each other. Shadows in morning describe lover's relationship before they completely understand each other. The shadow in morning is clear while in afternoon is dull and blur.
