Chapter Name: Should Wizard Hit Mommy?

Q1 What is the moral issue that the story raises?

Answer. The moral issue of the story encompasses the difference in the perceptions of children and adults. When the children are only able to focus on smaller things which bring them happiness, adults have a larger purview instilled with realism and wisdom.

Roger skunk was surrounded by unhappiness until he was endowed with the smell of roses by the wizard. He was happy after he smelled better and made a lot of friends. That was the ultimate happiness for him. Jo liked it that way as well but disliked the mommy of the skunk for bringing him in his original form, while Jack tried to explain through the ending of the story that nothing is better than accepting reality in its most authentic form.

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Q2 How does Jo want the story to end and why?

Answer. Jo was unhappy with the ending of the story because Roger skunk was turned into its original form, the stinking one. The form, when he was unhappy most of the times due to lack of friendship and acknowledgement. This made Jo dislike the story for its ending when Roger's mother pressured him for being that smelly creature again and hit the wizard for his deeds. Jo wanted to have his mother hit by the wizard instead and desired that the rosy smell of the Roger lasts forever.

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Q3 Why does Jack insist that it was the wizard that was hit and not the mother?

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Q4 What makes Jack feel caught in an ugly middle position?

He tried to end up in brief to make her fall asleep, but it went the other way. He had to drag his story in order to satiate his daughter.
