Answer. An MLA is a member of the Legislative Assembly. They are elected by the people of their constituency. The MLAs represent the people in their constituency in the Legislative Assembly.

Answer. The problem in Patalpuram was that there was a shortage of clean drinking water and lack of proper sanitation. Added to this, the people were dying of diseases while there was a shortage of proper medical facilities.

Public meeting – The people decided that the MLA must take responsibility for the deteriorating healthcare and sanitation conditions.

Legislative Assembly – The MLAs discussed the need for proper sanitation and healthcare facilities and asked the government about the steps it had taken to ensure the same.

Press Conference – The minister explained the steps taken to improve medical facilities and provide tankers which would supply clean drinking water.

Chief minister – He promised funds for the measures which the health minister suggested and said that the problem of garbage would be looked after too.
