

Answer. The number of children acting in the drama is  $3 \times 3 = 9$ .

Qb) Which are more — children making the sets or those acting?

Answer. Number of children making the sets are  $2 \times 3 = 6$  and, those who are acting  $= 3 \times 3 = 9$ . Clearly, 9 > 6. Thus, the number of children acting are more than those making the sets.

Qc) What is being done by most of the children?

Answer. Most of the children are playing music.

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Qd) How many children are collecting dresses?

Answer. Number of children collecting dresses are  $2 \times 3 = 6$ .



- Q1 From the picture we can see that:
- a) Half the children in the class take part in the Games Club.
- b) One fourth of the children are members of the Garden Club.
- c) The Drawing Club has one fourth of the children of the class.

If there are 200 students in the school, look at the above Chart and tell the number of members in each club

- The Games Club has members.
- The Garden Club has \_\_\_\_\_ members.
- There are \_\_\_\_ members in the Drawing Club.

Answer.



- Number of students in the school are = 200 Half of the children are in the Games Club. So. the Games Club has  $\left(200 \times \frac{1}{2}\right)$  = 100 children. Game Club has 100 members.
- One-fourth of the children are in the Garden Club. So, the Garden Club has  $\left(200 \times \frac{1}{4}\right)$  = 50 children. Garden Club has 50 members.
- One-fourth of the children are in the Drawing Club.. So, the Drawing Club has  $\left(200 \times \frac{1}{4}\right)$  = 50 children.

There are 50 members in the Drawing Club.

Who like to get wet in the rain = 
$$28 \times \frac{3}{4} = 7 \times 3 = 21$$
   
 • Who does not like to wet in the rain =  $28 \times \frac{1}{4} = 7$

# Total Number of children

Find out from the table:

- Children who like milk are / of the total children.

Show the liking for Tea, Coffee or Milk in a Chart.

# Answer.

- Children who like mik are  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the total children.
- Children who like coffee are 10/40 = 1/4
