Q1 What was the author's opinion about Mr Gessler as a bootmaker?

Answer. The author had a high opinion about Mr Gessler as a bootmaker. He knew that Mr Gessler made only what was ordered, and the boots that he made never failed to fit. The author felt that to make such boots as Mr Gessler did seemed mysterious and wonderful.

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Q2 Why did the author visit the shop so infrequently?

Answer. Then, he said that the shoes should not have creaked. He then asked the author to send the boots back, and if he could do nothing of them, he would take them off his bill.

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Q4 What was Mr Gessler's complaint against "big firms"?

Answer. Mr Gessler's complaint against big firms was that they got customers only because of advertising, and not because of any quality work. Mr Gessler, who loved his job and who used to make good quality boots, had very little work because people preferred the big firms.

(iii) Do they buy ready-made clothes, or buy cloth and get their clothes stitched by a tailor? Which do they think is better?


Answer. (1) Yes, they prefer buying their provisions loose from the smaller stores near their house.
